

Bottom


Charging Dock



To charge, place the **Left** side of the tablet on the charging dock. When done successfully, the tablet should not be able to move side-to-side. The tablet will also make a sound if the volume is turned on.

The red dot should be in the position displayed above while charging.

Tablet Home Screen




The **Status Bar** displays time, notifications, internet connection, and battery life.

The Navigation bar located at the bottom of the tablet, has the buttons that operate the tablet.







	Recent Applications Button Shows your most frequently used application


Telehealth Visits with Zoom

Over the course of the research, you will participate in Telehealth meetings with Zoom. During these interviews, we will ask you about any doctor visits and other healthcare usage, including new medications or procedures.

How to connect with your Telehealth provider on Zoom

	<p>Step 1) Tap on the Zoom icon, located in the Applications area located on the Home Screen of the tablet.</p>
	<p>Step 2) Click the blue “Join a Meeting” option, located on the Zoom screen that opens.</p>
	<p>Step 3) Tap on the blue arrow icon, to display a list of contacts. Or type in the Zoom ID number below: 796 692 2365</p>
	<p>Step 4) Click on the Aging Tech name and Zoom number. The number you click should match the one pictured and mentioned above.</p>
	<p>Step 5) Click “Join” and wait for the Telehealth meeting to start!</p>

Google Home Screen Break Down

Below is a breakdown of Google Chrome's Home screen.

Home Button	The home button will return you to the Chrome homepage, as pictured above. This is useful in case there are any issues with the webpage you are viewing and need to start the process again.
Open Tabs	This button will show you a list of webpages that were opened recently, but not fully closed. If you are on a webpage and tab on another link, it will open that page in the new tab. If you are looking for a website you were looking at recently, it may be here.
Search Bar	You can search the internet or visit websites by entering text here. For example, you can simply type "Recipes" and it will search for that via Google, or you can type in "allrecipes.com" and it will go to that website.
Frequent Places	This is a list of websites that are visited frequently. If you find yourself going to a particular website often, it should show up here for your convenience.
